Science and Design & Tech

During Science, we have been learning about filtration and distillation techniques. In groups, we made our own filters and solar sills.

We made the filters by putting a coffee filter in a funnel and pouring dirty water into the funnel, which came out in a plastic cup. In the end, we had clean water. 😊

We made the solar sills with an aluminium tray in a shoe box. Then we got an aluminium bowl and put that in the middle of the tray. We poured some salted water in the tray. We covered the top of the shoe box with gladwrap and put a rock directly in the middle of the gladwrap. The water was supposed to evaporate and hit the gladwrap and trail down under the rock, then drip into the cup and leave the salt on the tray. In the end, this experiment failed. 😞

Now we are designing and constructing our own water filters for Design and Tech that will hopefully produce clean water.



Room 4




