School Uniform Policy

Students at Wallaroo Mines Primary School are expected to wear the WMPS School Uniform every day unless otherwise stated by the school. The WMPS Uniform is designed to help ensure student safety, provide affordable and practical school attire, and to ensure students feel part of the WMPS community.

Our Uniform

- Navy blue short/long sleeved school polo top, or plain navy polo top.
- Plain navy-blue shorts or track pants with a small logo is acceptable. No denim, stripes or large logos are acceptable.
- Navy blue polar fleece jumper featuring the school logo, or plain navy jumper.
- Plain navy-blue zip jacket.
- Blue white checked school dress.
- Plain long sleeved under shirt – navy blue, gold or white.
- Enclosed shoes.
- Navy blue bucket hat.

- * The school stocks polo shirts, jumpers, shorts and hats and can be purchased throughout the year.
- * Payment by instalment can be arranged by negotiation.

Non-Compliance

Under the Department's Policy, the principal must enforce the dress code of the school and may take appropriate disciplinary action in relation to intentional and persistent breach of the code. This may include restricted access to play areas, separate play and learning arrangements and students who are consistently in incorrect uniform may be provided uniforms by the school for the duration of the school day.

- If your child is unable to wear uniform, please provide a note in their diary/communication book. Otherwise, students not in uniform will be given a reminder via their diary/communication book.
- Students consistently not in uniform will be required to change into a uniform provided by the school, parents will be contacted before this occurs.
- Students who refuse to wear school uniform or change into a uniform provided by the school may be sent home to change, they may return once they are in correct uniform.
- In the interests of student safety any student not wearing school uniform will not be able to participate in activities outside of the school.
